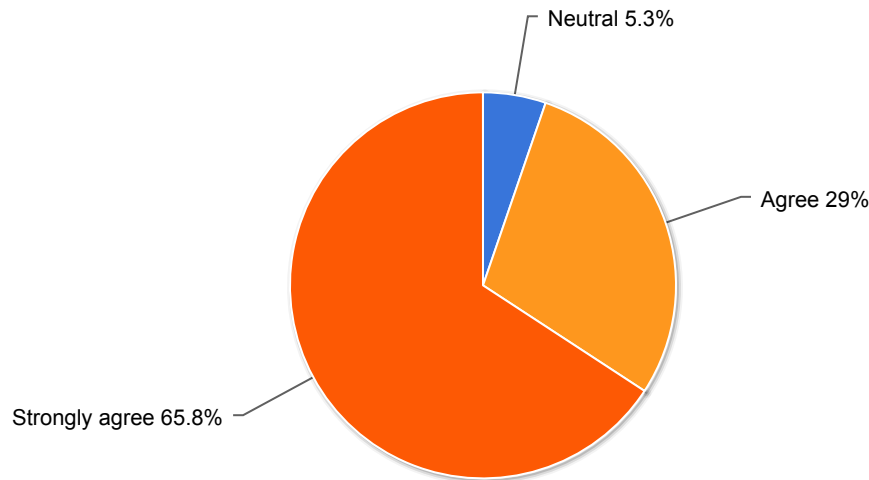

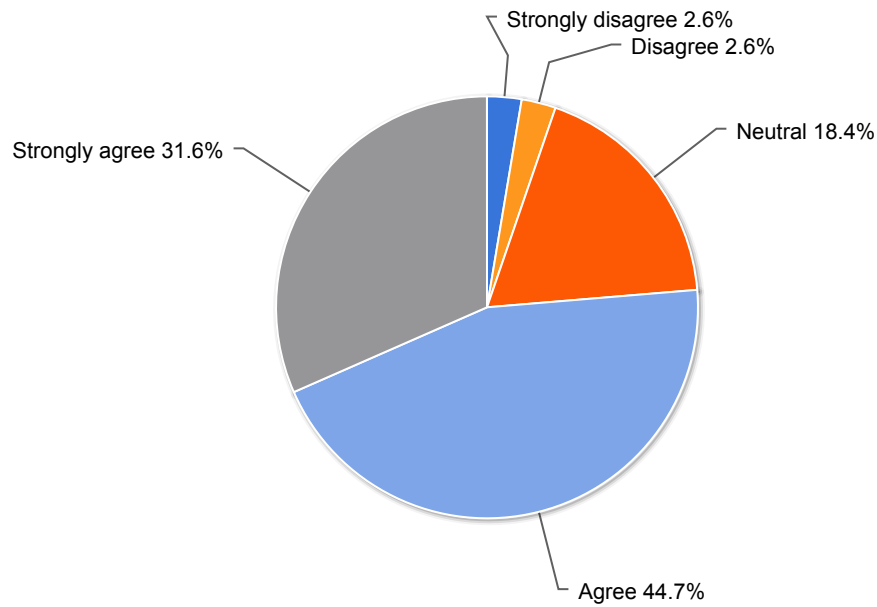

2. I understand the variety of experiences which can occur following a traumatic event, including the phenomenon of "natural recovery."

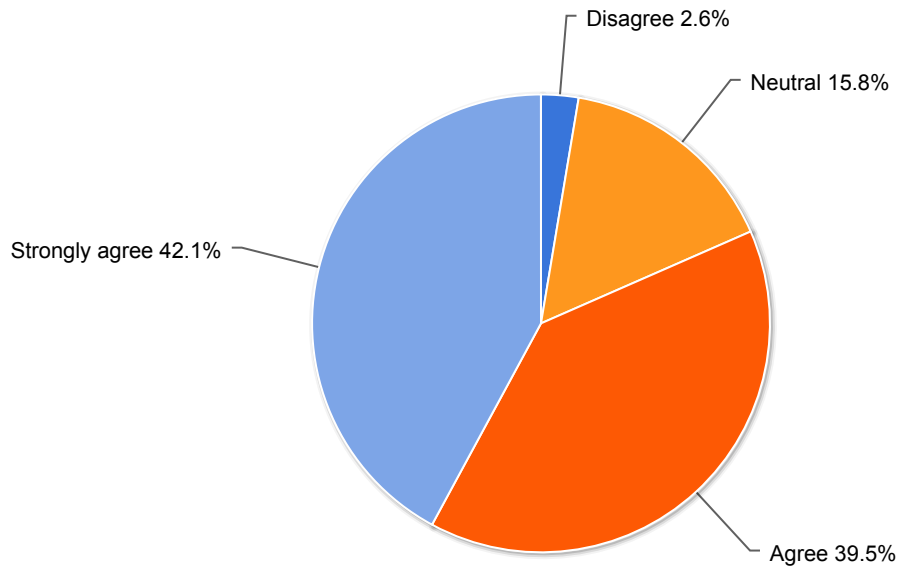

3. I can distinguish between "resilience" and "posttraumatic growth."

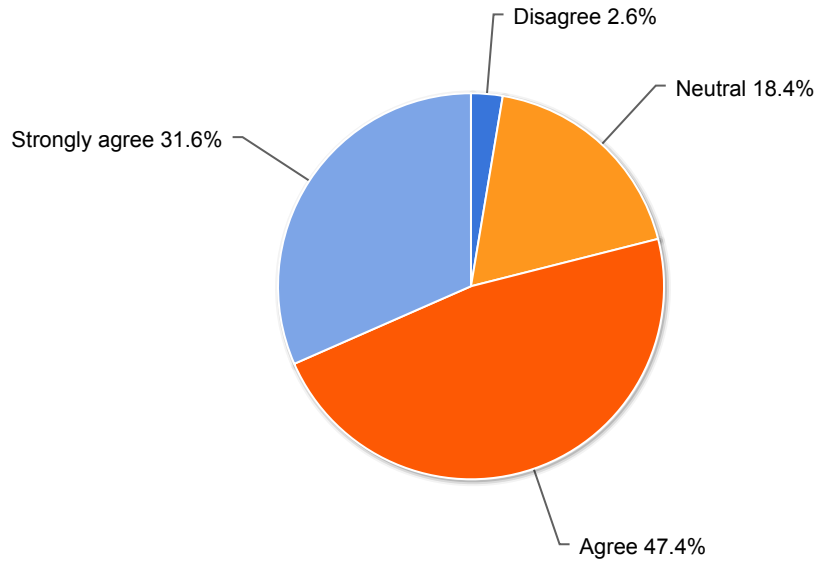

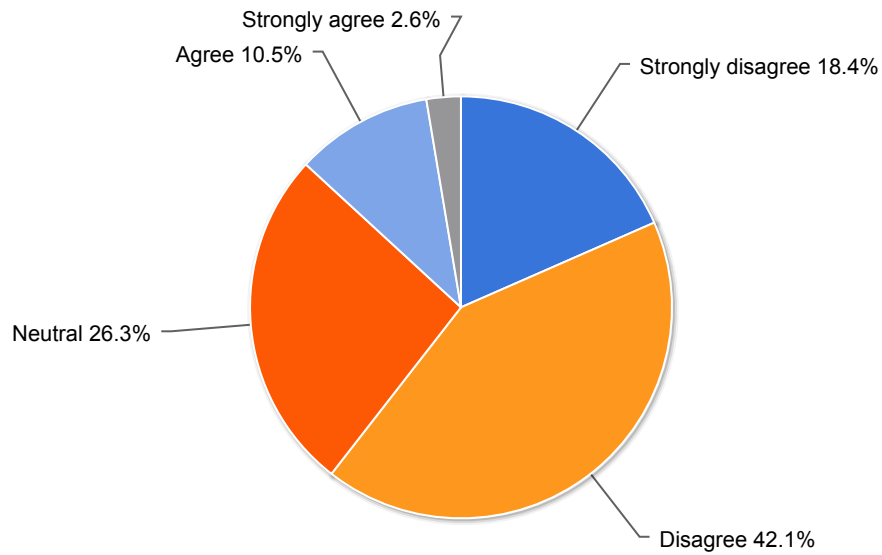

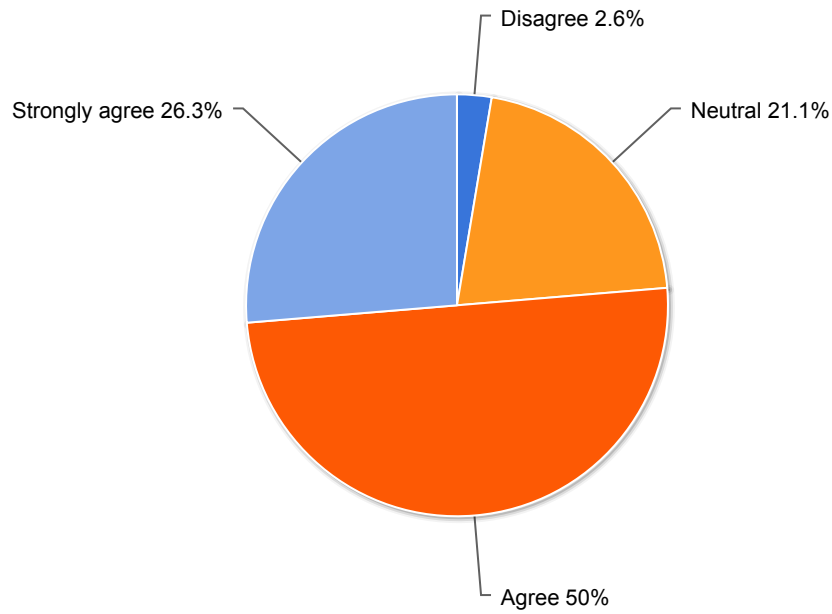

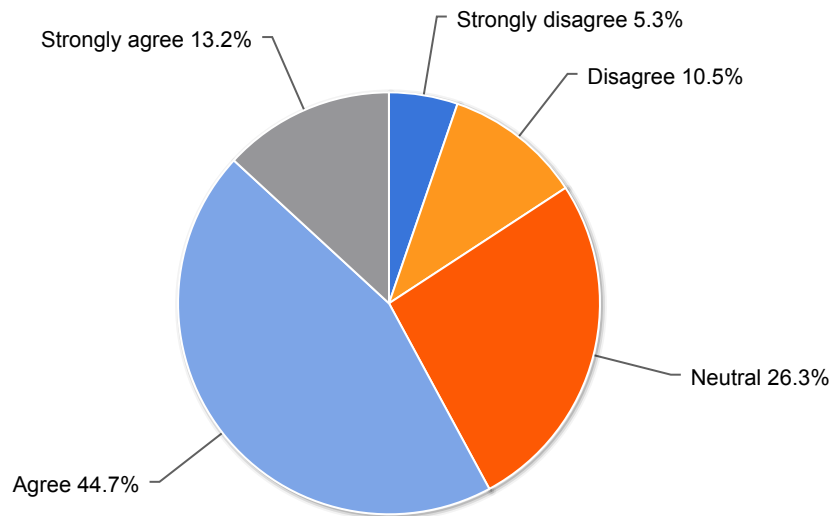

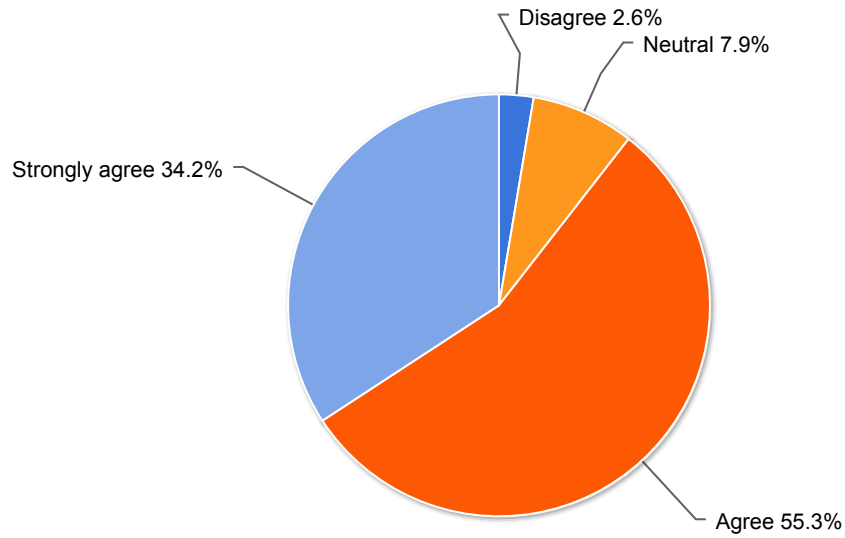

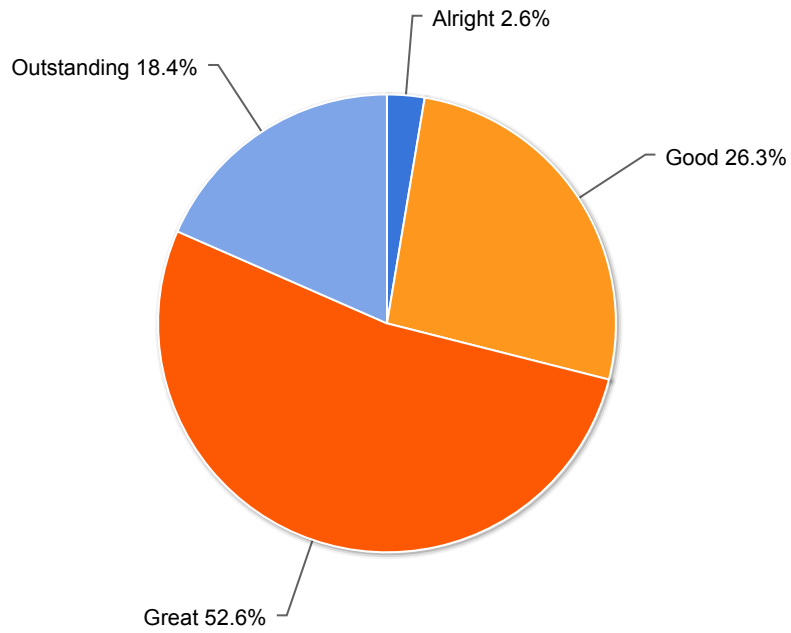

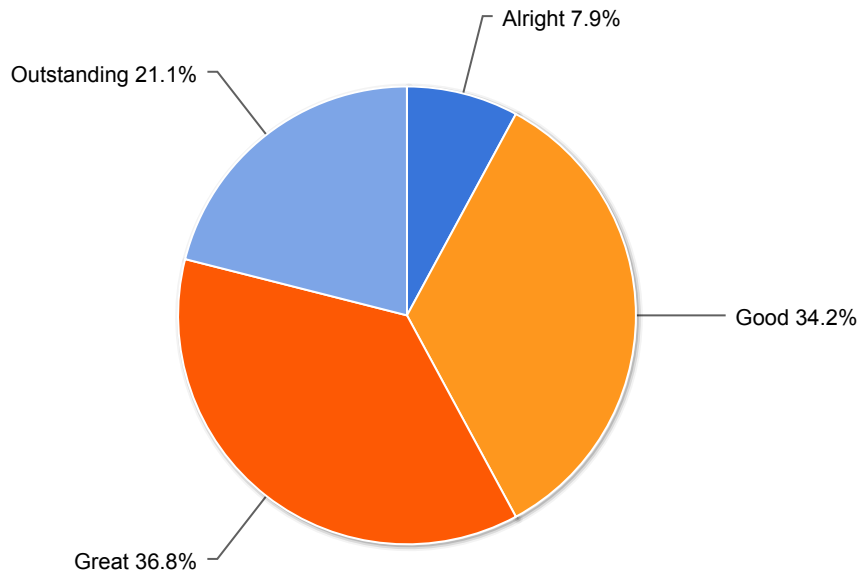

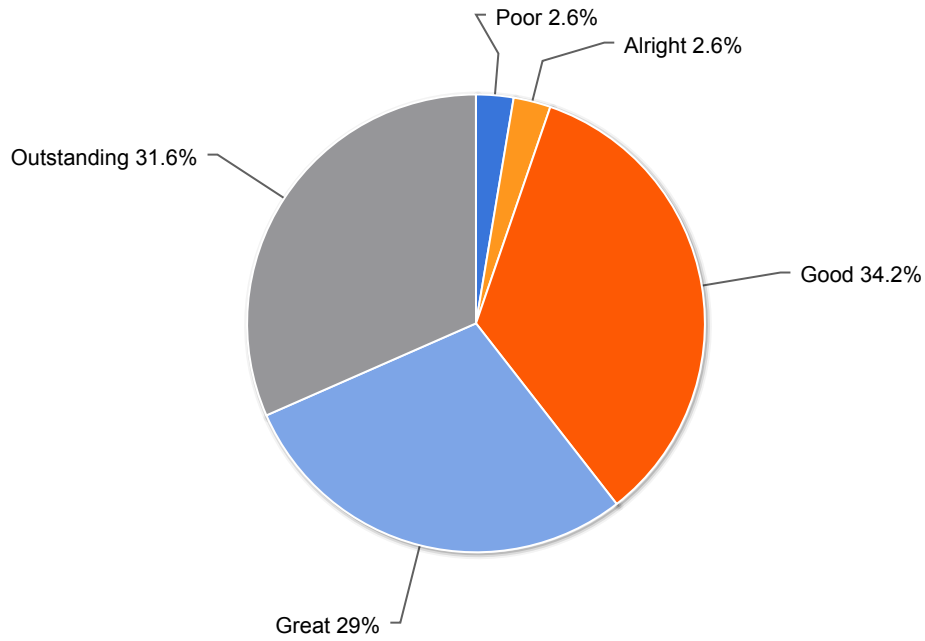

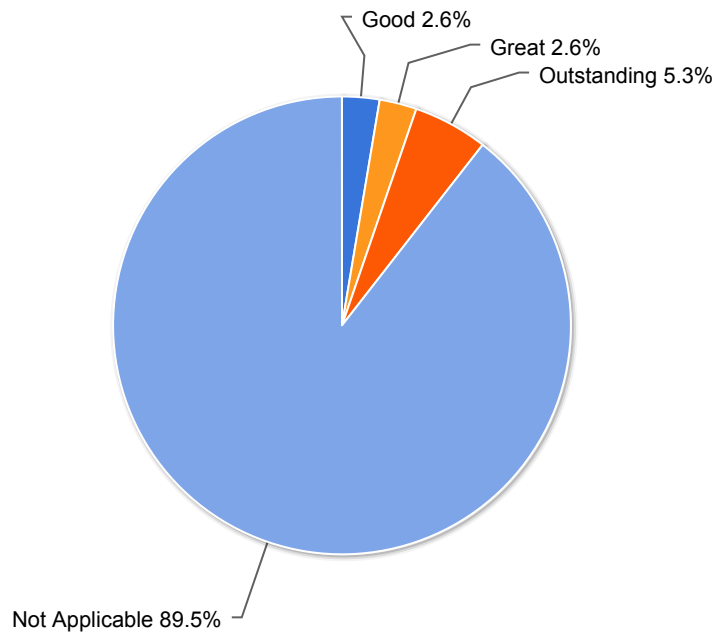

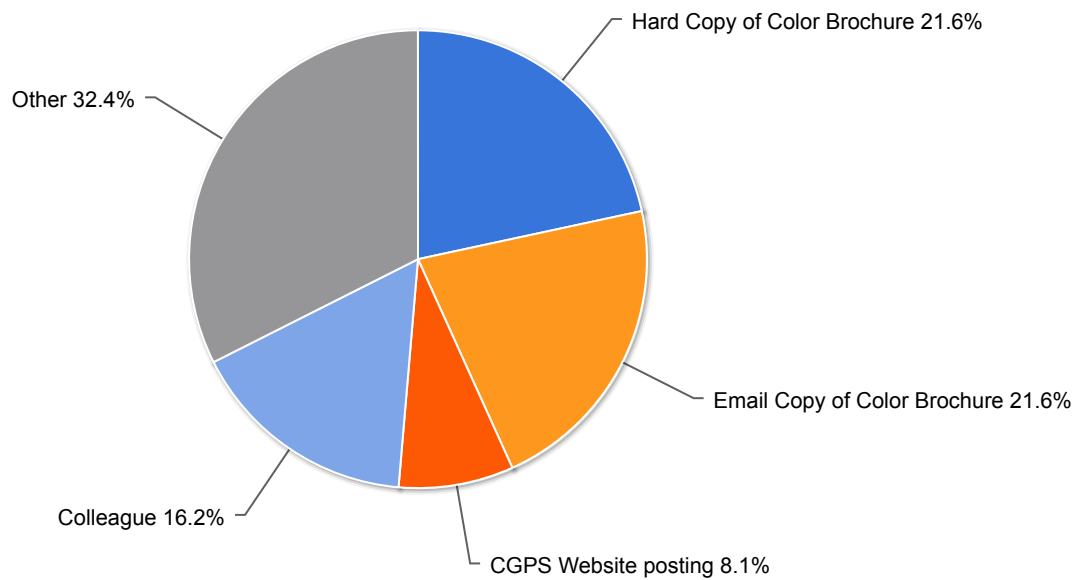
